Youngcare is a national not-for-profit charity revolutionising the way young people with high physical support needs live – with freedom, dignity and choice.

Suitable and appropriate supported housing is one of the greatest areas of unmet need for people with disabilities in Australia. Currently, there are thousands of young people with disabilities being left behind in aged care facilities. Even more are isolated in hospital rooms, rehabilitation centres and institutions; living at home with aging parents; inappropriate accommodation that is not suitable for their age or care needs.

Youngcare is creating a more inclusive Australia by empowering industry, government and community to work together and challenge the way society views disability.

We develop aspirational Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA), advocate for much-needed policy change, deliver vital grants programs, and provide education, advice and pathways through our free support service.



Why Youngcare?

For almost two decades Youngcare has lead the way in designing and developing innovative and quality disability housing. Our services are end-to-end, including; site acquisition and procurement, architectural design and development, final delivery, handover and tenanting. Built to exceed Specialist Disability Accommodation standards, our development blueprints and intellectual property are second to none.

Youngcare's housing will always adhere to the following principles;

- Connectedness to community
- Access to essential services
- Ability to live independently

These principles all tie into our overarching mission to deliver freedom, choice and control to young people with high physical support needs.

Youngcare does not receive any recurrent government funding for our programs; our heart is at the centre of our mission, and people come first.



Youngcare Housing

Youngcare housing supports young people's choice to live their young lives in quality, Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA).

- Mission based organisations including;
 Catholic Archdiocese, De Luca Foundation, The Salvation Army.
- Youngcare owned, managed and developed projects including; ownership with JV, single ownership, bespoke projects and secondary income projects.

Youngcare Connect

The Youngcare Connect Support Service assists families and individuals to navigate the often complicated health, housing and disability systems. From providing expert NDIS and SDA advice, linking people with appropriate services to identifying funding or housing opportunities. Youngcare Connect is run by a dedicated, compassionate and qualified team of friendly specialists, clinicians and outreach staff.

Youngcare Grants Programs

Youngcare's Grants assist people with high physical support needs to stay home, move home, or make a house a home. The Grants provide vital funding for equipment, home modifications, household items, utilities and essential support that is unable to be funded through the NDIS. The funding provided goes beyond items that are considered 'reasonable and necessary', instead focusing on increasing support and quality of life.

Since 2009, Youngcare has provided over \$10 million in funding for more than 1,610 Grants to individuals in need.



Vacancy


The Youngcare Connect free support service receives hundreds of phone calls and emails every month from young people with high physical support needs, their family, friends and support workers. This service has produced a growing database of prospective tenants, who are exploring their SDA options, people who may require SDA in the future, as well as service provider contacts. Youngcare utilises this database, along with other strategies, to manage vacancies.

With the mission at the centre of all we do, Youngcare always recommend the most appropriate solution for an individual's needs – whether that be Youngcare housing, or another provider – ensuring young people have choice and control over their living situation.

Along with the Youngcare Connect database, the following strategies are used to identify and match suitable tenants:

- Partnerships with mission aligned SIL providers; identifying potential tenants for Youngcare housing.
- Media partnerships with Channel Nine and Nova; in-kind advertising campaigns
- High profile ambassadors; utilising online presence to assist Youngcare's mission
- High profile events; platform to share mission with audience
- Corporate Partnerships; Youngcare housing campaigns across digital platforms
- Strong relationships with peak disability groups representing prospective SDA tenants
- Strong relationships with Government stakeholders; requesting links with relevant constituents.
- Tenant surveys; monitoring resident's health and well-being, identifying risks to ongoing tenancy.

Youngcare proactively reports tenanting progress to Development Partners during the Construction/Pre-tenancy phase of an SDA Development, as well as ongoing KPI reporting to owners each month after the building is tenanted.
